

TASTY TEMPTATIONS

It's almost St. Patrick's Day, and for some that means boiling up a nice authentic Irish dinner of corned beef and cabbage. So, here's the recipe for it.



Corned Beef and Cabbage

Ingredients:

- 1 (appx 4 pounds) corned beef brisket with spice packet
- 3 quarts water
- 1 onion, quartered
- 3 carrots, cut into large chunks
- 3 stalks celery, cut into 2 inch pieces
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 pounds red potatoes, halved
- 1 small head cabbage, cut into eighths

Directions:

- Combine corned beef and spice packet contents, water, onion, carrots, celery, and salt together in a large pot or Dutch

oven; bring to a simmer, skimming off any foam that rises to the surface

- Cover the pot, reduce heat to low and simmer until meat is almost fork-tender, about 3 hours. Add potatoes and simmer, uncovered, until potatoes are almost tender, about 30 more minutes.
- Place cabbage pieces on top of and around meat, cover the pot and simmer until cabbage is tender (20-30 minutes)
- Remove meat to a cutting board and let rest 10 to 15 minutes. Cut across the grain and serve in a bowl; ladle vegetables and broth over the top.
- Pair with an Irish Porterhouse Red Ale or Murphy's Irish Stout.
