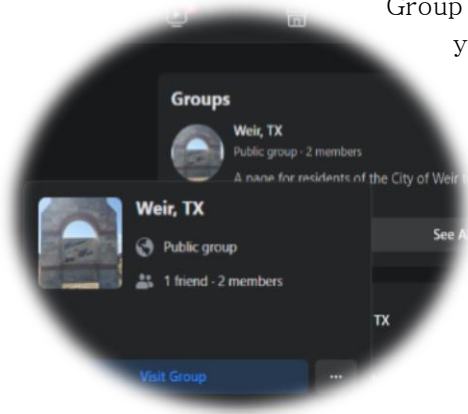

## TASTY TEMPTATIONS

### \*Deep Fried Cajun Turkey\*



#### Ingredients:

##### *FOR THE CAJUN RUB:*

- 6 tablespoons salt
- 3 tablespoons cayenne pepper (adjust down to decrease spice level)
- 3 tablespoons garlic powder
- 2 tablespoons paprika
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- 2 tablespoons dried thyme
- 1 tablespoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon onion powder

##### *FOR THE CAJUN INJECTION LIQUID:*

- 1 cup lemon juice
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup olive oil
- $\frac{3}{4}$  cup salted butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons onion powder
- 2 tablespoons garlic powder
- 2 teaspoons Tabasco
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper

#### **Preparing your fryer for the turkey**

1. Set your fryer system up outside on a flat surface, away from the house. Check the capacity of your frying system to see what size of turkey it can accommodate. Most fryers can accommodate an 18-lb turkey, and I would purchase a 15-17-lb turkey to be safe.
2. Next, you need to figure out how much oil to deep fry a turkey. To figure out how much peanut oil you need in your fryer, stick the turkey in the frying pot and then fill the pot with water, up to two inches above the turkey. Take the turkey out the pot and thoroughly pat the skin dry.
3. Use a piece of tape to record the water line, then remove the water and dry the pot thoroughly.
4. Fill the pot with oil up to the mark, turn the heat to medium-high, and heat the oil to 375°F.

#### Directions:

Prepare the Cajun spice rub and Cajun injection liquid.

Prepare turkey, removing neck and giblets from cavity, and patting dry with paper towels.

Prepare fryer by adding peanut oil and heating to 375 degrees F.

Inject turkey with Cajun injection fluid, about one ounce of injection for each pound of turkey.

Pat turkey skin dry, then thoroughly coat skin and inside of cavity with Cajun spice rub.

Fry the turkey (3.5 pounds per minute) until thickest part of breast registers at 165°F.

Allow turkey to rest for about 30 minutes before carving.

## \*Hot Toddy

### Ingredients:

- 1 oz Bourbon
- 1 tbsp Honey
- 2 tsp fresh lemon juice
- 1/4 cup boiling hot water



### Directions:

- Put Bourbon, honey, and lemon juice in a 6oz mug
- Heat water in a tea kettle or microwave and pour into mug
- Stir until the honey has disappeared into the hot water
- Garnish with a lemon round and/or cinnamon stick and serve
